





# Introduction

## **Previous Research**

- Adolescents use social networking sites to **seek** mental health help
- Previous literature has focused on teenagers seeking help for depression on social media Research Gap
- It remains unknown how adolescents use **Reddit** to seek support for anxiety

## Purpose:

To understand which topics of posts about anxiety are most prevalent and



have the most engagement under the *r/teenagers* subreddit

# Methods

## Design

 Content analysis of Reddit posts under r/teenagers when searching "anxiety help"

# Subjects

- The first 100 posts were analyzed (not including comments)
- Posts were sorted by relevance & posts from 1 year ago to present were included
- Exclusions: advertisements, parents reporting on behalf of teen, or posts not discussing anxiety

# Measures

Variables:

# 1. Engagement


number of upvotes and comments

# 2. Anxiety topic

- topics: school, family, social, phone, work, money, romantic relationships, health, and other
- Post dates were also recorded.

## Analysis

The number of posts per topic & average number of upvotes/comments were evaluated.



Many adolescents experience anxiety in settings, or engage with posts about th This is possibly a result of social isolation the **pandemic**.


Money was the least prevalent and had smallest number of comments & upvote suggesting that this is not a frequent po discussion among anxious teenagers.


